Remembering the 100th Anniversary of the Battle of the Somme

On **Friday 1st July**, there will be a full day of remembrance for those who fell on the first day of the Battle of the Somme.

- **7.28am**, the time when the battle started. Bishop Frank, Assistant Bishop of Newcastle will light a candle of remembrance.
- **On the hour every hour** – readings & prayers
- **7.00pm** - closing ceremony with the blessing of a canister of soil from the Somme in the presence of Bishop Christine (Bishop of Newcastle), Bishop Seamus (the Roman Catholic Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle) and other church leaders. Standard Bearers holding the County Standard and the Union Flag either side of the altar at all times.
