Remembering the 100th Anniversary of the Battle of the Somme

On **Friday 1st July** there will be a full day of remembrance for those who fell on the first day of the Battle of the Somme in 1916.

- **7.28am:** This was the time when the battle started. Bishop Frank, Assistant Bishop of Newcastle, will light a candle of remembrance.
- **On the hour every hour:** Readings and prayers.
- **7.00pm:** Closing ceremony, with the blessing of a canister of soil from the Somme in the presence of Bishop Christine (Bishop of Newcastle), Bishop Seamus (the Roman Catholic Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle), and other church leaders. Standard Bearers will be holding the County Standard and the Union Flag either side of the altar at all times.

Please join us at any time during the day.

Daily Prayer

Members of the congregation and visitors are invited to join in with the daily round of prayer and worship (the ‘Daily Offices’) at the Cathedral.

Morning services take place in St George’s Chapel, and our sung evening services in the Quire, as follows:

On Fridays, either Bishop Christine or Bishop Frank usually presides at the Eucharist, and all who wish gather for breakfast in the Lantern Café afterwards.

The clergy are always delighted to share these Daily Offices with those who choose to join them – both members of the congregation and visitors. Please do consider joining us – either regularly (even if just once a week) or to mark a particular occasion or anniversary. And if you cannot be with us in the Cathedral, you are encouraged to try to remember the times when prayer and worship are being offered here – and, if your timetable allows it, to time your own quiet time or time of prayer to coincide with the prayer times at the Cathedral; such a practice is an expression of our belief in the communion of saints. Do speak with one of the clergy if you

would like to know more about the Daily Offices, or if you would appreciate some help with your own discipline of prayer.

Suspended coffee

A suspended coffee is the advance purchase of a cup of coffee for someone who would be grateful for it but who is unable to pay for it. It can help such a person by providing, not just a hot drink, but the opportunity for engagement with another human being through conversation.

The price will be added to the cost of your purchases, and will enable us to provide a free cup of coffee for someone in need. Thank you for supporting us.
