Appointment of the new Dean – Message from Sir Philip Mawer

‘As most of you will know, it has been my privilege to chair, at the request of the Archbishop of York, the panel for the appointment of the new Dean. The Cathedral has been fully and very effectively represented in that process by Eric Jubb and David Lawrence, as well as by Canon Ian Flintoft from the College of Canons. I pay tribute to them and all the members of the panel for their part in this process.

‘The panel met on Friday 1st June to interview a number of candidates. I am glad to say that we were successful in making an appointment and that we made it unanimously.

‘I realise that you will all immediately want to know the name of your new Dean. I am afraid I am going to have to disappoint you on that. You will realise that such appointments are subject to a number of checks before they can be ratified, so an announcement is unlikely much before the end of this month. I can only assure you that as soon as an announcement can be made, it will be made.

‘Meanwhile there is much praying to be done – for the candidates who were not appointed; for your new Dean; for the Chapter, staff and congregation of the Cathedral as you prepare for a new and exciting phase in the life of the Cathedral; and most of all for the mission and witness of the Cathedral itself, to the City and to all of the Diocese of Newcastle. May God go with us all as we move forward, confident in our faith and excited by the opportunities ahead of us.’
