Bookstall

The Bookstall has been replenished. Titles for Lent include: Wendy Beckett's ***The Art of Lent*** – a painting a day from Ash Wednesday to Easter, looking at some of the world's greatest paintings; Janet Morley's ***The Heart's Time*** – a poem a day for Lent and Easter; Leigh Hatts' ***Keeping Lent and Easter*** – discovering the rhythms and riches of the Christian seasons; Tom Wright's ***Lent for Everyone: Mark***; and Megan Daffern's ***Songs of the Spirit*** – a psalm a day for Lent and Easter.
