Fr Thomas Sharp has served his Title for the last year in the parish of Holy Nativity, Chapel House, and was ordained priest here in the Cathedral last Sunday. His training incumbent, The Revd Juliet Stevenson, has taken a new post in Liverpool, and so Canon MacLaren has been asked to take on his training and supervision amongst us here. Fr Thomas will be with us part-time – Sundays and two days a week – as he is embarking on a full time PhD at Durham University in October. We look forward to welcoming him early in September.
