Cathedral clergy helping in the Diocese

The Cathedral clergy offer to officiate in parishes in the Diocese which are currently without an Incumbent or where their priest is on holiday or unwell. Canon Harvey is at Alwinton this morning.

Pathways Mission: Thursday 6th – Sunday 9th September

Over the weekend of 6th to 9th September, the Bishops of the Northern Province and their teams, led by Archbishop Sentamu, will be joining us to assist us in our mission of **‘growing church bringing hope’**. The Diocese of Newcastle will be the fifth Diocese to welcome the Northern Bishops for a mission weekend.

The weekend will begin on the Thursday afternoon with a Welcome and Commissioning Service on Holy Island, where invited deanery representatives will meet with the visiting Bishops and their teams, who will then be sent out to their host Deaneries. Each parish is being asked to organise mission activities, large or small, where the visiting teams can engage with people in our communities who would not usually attend church events. During past mission weekends there have been a wide variety of activities, each of which had a moment where people could hear a simple and engaging explanation of the Christian faith. The weekend will conclude on the Sunday afternoon with three celebration services in Alnwick, Hexham and Newcastle (at the Racecourse).

On Friday 7th September, at 7.30pm, the Cathedral will host an ‘Evening with Archbishop Sentamu’. All are invited to this occasion. You will find two invitations in today’s service paper; one is for you, and one is for you to give to someone else – ideally someone who does not attend church but who you think might be interested in engaging with the Archbishop.

Crèche

The service is relayed into the chapel, to enable parents and carers to continue to follow what is going on in the Eucharist.
