Peal of bells today

Howard Smith, our Tower Captain, writes: 'Should you still be near the Cathedral just after mid-day today you will hear our glorious ring of bells burst forth into song. On this 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War, we will be attempting to ring a whole peal of Stedman Cinques, taking about three and a half hours. On 11th November 1918, Newcastle Cathedral was the only Church with a ring of twelve bells that

managed to ring a whole peal to give thanks for the end of the war. We are ringing today to honour all those, of many countries, who went to war in support of what they believed to be a just cause. A war that many thought would be over in a matter of months dragged on for over four years, and at the end over eight million soldiers had died. Our bells say 'thank you' to those who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and show that the memory of them is not forgotten. I leave it to you, the reader, to say your own personal prayers for those who died, and for the world today.'

Invitation to a book launch

Wendy Rogerson, who worshipped here in the Cathedral in the 1950s – and was inspired in her future work by former Bishop of Newcastle Noel Hudson, a previous Bishop of Labuan and Sarawak – has published a book about the three years she spent nursing in one of the world's wildest places. *Midwife of Borneo: The True Story of a Geordie Pioneer* (SPCK, £9.99) tells how in 1959 Wendy sailed to the island for USPG, where she ran a clinic 300 miles from the nearest town, and soon found herself becoming an anaesthetist and surgeon!
