Annual Meetings – Sunday 7th April 2019

The Annual Vestry Meeting and Parochial General Meeting of the Cathedral will take place on **Sunday 7th April 2019** after the Sung Eucharist. At the Vestry Meeting, the Churchwardens are appointed. This year, Sandra Hood will be stepping down after many years of loyal and devoted service, for which we are all grateful. I am therefore asking if (at least) five members of the congregation would be willing to volunteer to be a Deputy Churchwarden. I must stress that while it sounds a daunting office, the role of a Cathedral Warden is very different to that of a Warden in a Parish Church, and principally involves being on duty on a Sunday morning and an occasional Sunday Choral Evensong. Two Wardens usually cover the Sunday morning service, and one the evening service. But, if more people volunteer, there will be less for each to do. If we had eight people on the team, it would mean each person having to be on duty for only one Sunday morning per month, and to cover one Evensong every two months. So, could you spare just **one Sunday morning** each month to help out in this important role? If you think you could, please have a word with me or with one of the other Wardens. School of Prayer

On **Thursday this week, 28th March**, Fr George Guiver CR will lead a School of Prayer at the Cathedral. Fr George is a monk, and was until recently the Superior, of the Community of the Resurrection, the Anglican monastic community at Mirfield. He is the author of several books on prayer and worship, and is an excellent, engaging and accessible speaker. The theme of the day will be 'Prayer and other people'. Fr George writes: 'We think a lot about 'me and my prayer', but that's not quite the right question to ask. When we ask the right questions, we find doors start opening.'
